PLEASE TAKE NOTE

All visitors to National Parks are subject to the National Environmental Management Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 as amended, together with any Regulations and Internal Rules made in terms of this Act:

- WARNING!** You may not climb out nor hang out of your vehicle in the game viewing area.
- Getting out of your vehicle is only allowed in the designated areas indicated by signage, and then only at your own risk as there are dangerous animals.
- You may only drive on tourist roads.
- Do not enter a road that has a NO ENTRY sign or that is not indicated on the map.
- SPEED LIMIT 40km/h - DO NOT EXCEED THE SPEED LIMIT!**
- You may not injure, feed or disturb any form of wildlife.
- You may not uproot, pick, cut, damage, kill, remove or be in possession of any plant or animal and/or part of a plant or animal material, living or dead, from the Park.
- You may not place any arms, lenses, figure, symbols, mark or picture on any object.
- You may not be in possession of any poisons, explosives or of an unsealed or loaded fire-arm.
- Do not discard any burning objects, including cigarettes, anywhere in the Park - it may cause a fire.
- No loud music/ noise allowed in the Park or at picnic sites and swimming pools.
- You may not bring any pets, domestic animal or any other animal into the Park.
- DO NOT LITTER! This is your Park - PLASTIC KILLS!**
- Do not drive or park in such a manner that it is a nuisance, disturbance or an inconvenience to any other person.
- You may not cause any noise that is likely to disturb other people after 21h30 and before 06h00.
- You may not stay overnight at the Park without the knowledge of the Manager.
- Only designated accommodation areas may be used.
- Check closing times of the Park and game viewing areas - you may not travel in the Park outside of the stipulated times.
- You may not drive a vehicle in the Park without a valid Driver's licence.
- No motorcycles in the Park.
- The use of drones flies (and over) national parks is strictly prohibited.

Botanical Reserve
Jack's Pans. Sit in an old disjunct area within the 500 hectare Botanical Reserve. It is a protected area put aside to monitor the impact of megaherbivores - particularly elephants - on the subtropical thicket vegetation. Plant species and vegetation structure within this reserve are compared with similar areas outside this reserve to monitor long term effects.

Designated Lookout Points

- Dombing
- Lanting
- Kudu
- Spotted
- Algas Bay
